## Using INeedAPencil.com: Step-by-Step

Free and Effective SAT Prep

Follow this step-by-step guide to using INeedAPencil.com to structure your SAT prep.



1

**Enter** 'INeedAPencil.com' into your browser's address bar. In the middle of the page, enter your email address and a password—then hit 'Create My Account.'

2

**Browse** the welcome page that visually walks you through the site. Check out the help section and FAQs.

3

**Diagnostic Test #1:** Go to 'Test Gateway' → 'Full-Length Practice' and download the PDF for the first full length test. Follow on-screen directions.

5

**Questions:** Practice by answering questions at the 'Test Gateway.' Use the SQG to do one at a time, or the CPS to customize a session to your time/subject needs. Read through each explanation after submitting your answers, mark tough questions for review and archive super easy questions. Check out the performance summary after each testing session. Watch your projected score rise on your personal home page.

**Lessons:** Start learning SAT topics by going to 'Study Gateway.' Mark lessons as complete when you master the material and mark tough ones for review to come back to it later.

**Review:** At the 'Solidify Gateway' you can review tough question and check out notes you wrote on different lessons. This is critical to solidify the material you found most challenging, so that you don't repeat your mistakes in the future.

**Send** progress reports to yourself and your mentors each week by visiting the Mentor Communication page and following on-screen directions. Also, send tough questions to mentors during testing sessions with the online tools.

**Read up** on INeedAPencil.com 'Articles' for college prep.

**Diagnostic Test #2:** Now that you've learned your lessons and completed your practice questions, it's time to measure up one last time before you sit for the real SAT. Follow on-screen directions.
